Dear Dinjerra Families,

After a few years in the making, Happy finally did! He passed his final assessment, Making him a certified Therapy Dog, earning him his jacket. On the 17th of March Happy and I left home at 6:30am to make our way to Ferntree Gully. We arrived nice and early allowing us time to go for a walk before starting the assessment day at Lead The Way Institute. Happy throughout the day undertook a series of assessment's checking his obedience which tested he could follow commands of sit, drop, stop, leave it, No. He engaged in scenarios where other people walked him and where I had to pay attention to other dogs (Happy didn't like me petting other dogs, but he managed).



They tested Happy on his resource guarding to see he could be patted when eating and share his food, he also was tested with noises, like vacuums, angry people, and excited people (lucky no one clapped really loud lol) and crowding which he passed his flying colours lifting his leg up asking for a belly rub (thank you for the training everyone).

Happy was tested and passed lots of other scenarios. The biggest one was his community visit to Yooralla. Where he shone and brought happiness to many people manoeuvring around motorised wheelchairs and interacting with people of all abilities. I'm extremely proud of Happy and would like to thank you all for helping me train him and prepare him for his certification. All your pats, tummy rubs, attention and claps made Happy and me prepare for his assessment.

Now that Happy is certified he will be coming to school more often, slowly increasing the amount of days he comes to work. Remember when you see Happy the rule is you say hi to me first and ask if you can pat him, so that he is ready.






