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Homework and Practising

Dinjerra Primary School has developed our Homework Policy in consultation with the School Council to support student learning and wellbeing by:

- providing opportunities for students to review, revise and reinforce newly acquired skills
- fostering good lifelong learning and study habits
- supporting learning partnerships with parents/carers.

At Dinjerra Primary School all homework set by teachers will be:

- purposeful
- · curriculum-aligned appropriate to students' skill level and age
- designed to help students develop as independent learners
- monitored by the teacher where appropriate, provide opportunities for parents/carers to partner in their child's learning.

The types of homework that teachers at Dinjerra Primary School will include are:

- practising Mathematics counting and time goals
- mathematics activities based on learning goals (Mathletics/Mathseeds tasks)
- practising spelling words
- reading of 'just right' books
- literacy activities based on learning goals (Reading Eggs tasks) (Prep to 2)

IMPLEMENTATION

Year Level	The following information outlines the homework tasks that can be selected for each level.
Prep	Reading of 'just right' books Practising letter ID, Oxford words or Maths counting/time goal
1/2	Reading of 'just right' books – 10 minutes Practising spelling of Personal Words or Maths counting/time goal – 5 minutes
3/4	20 – 30 minutes per day Reading of 'just right' books – 10 minutes Practising of Personal Words – 5 minutes Practising of Maths counting or time goal – 5 minutes Mathematics activities based on learning goals (Mathletics tasks) – 5 minutes
5/6	Reading of 'just right' books – 15 minutes Practising of Personal Words – 5 minutes Practising of Maths counting or time goal – 5 minutes Mathematics activities based on learning goals (Mathletics tasks) – 5 minutes Unfinished work – 10 minutes

Shortly, your child's first cycle of Individual Goals will be published via Compass Learning Tasks in the areas of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Mathematics

At Dinjerra Primary School, **goal setting** is a major aspect and driver in our curriculum. When students have goals they have identified and are aspiring to, a positive correlation is seen in student agency, stimulation and motivation in learning, and an overall contributor to Wellbeing.

Goal setting is evident through all of our four School Values. Having an engaging goal, making a plan of action, demonstrating discipline and effort, using a growth mindset, and celebrating successes, are all ways that

humans can learn, grow and take pride in their achievements.

Our school mural, as well as being an outstanding piece of art, is a representation of how we approach learning at Dinjerra. Students are supported in their learning and wellbeing. We use goal setting in Literacy and Numeracy to guide students through life, using positive self-talk, instilling motivation and confidence, and guiding students to apply goal

setting to their learning, daily activities and life.

It is our vision that this goal oriented approach will support students in their future, knowing that with the right plan of action, the right amount of effort and discipline, their possibilities are endless. I enjoy this
